Farming at Eliada Homes has a long and rich tradition dating back to 1907. For over half a century, children living at Eliada would contribute to the farm's operations, including growing crops, raising dairy cattle, and tending to an apple orchard.

In 2017, the campus farm program was revitalized with the building of a new geodesic greenhouse building. In the following years, the campus farm program has continued to grow and now includes the Hoophouse, a market garden, a corn field, a fruit forest, raised bed gardens, and agricultural education classes for Eliada students.

Education

Eliada Academy, our on-campus school, in conjunction with the Campus Farm Program offers year-round agricultural education opportunities and courses for children ages 11-17. Semester-long courses meet the curriculum requirements for NC Public schools and focus on hands-on, garden-based learning.

Annual Curriculum:

Spring: Biology

This course explores core concepts of biology with a strong emphasis on agricultural biology and hands-on work.

Fall: Agriscience

This course explores core concepts of environmental science, natural resources, food production, science, and agribusiness.

Summer Session

Eight-week semester of hands-on farm production work including planting, cultivating, weeding, and harvesting. The Farm partnered with Buncombe County Cooperative Extension's Nutrition Education program to host a six-week education program available to students and taught by their Nutrition Education Specialist.





Summer Camp

The farm hosted weekly summer camp garden sessions with Child Development's Summer Camp Program this year. Each Monday for eight-week's children ages 5-12 got to spend time in the greenhouse and garden helping to harvest produce and learn about growing food.

Partner Highlight: The Appalachian Sustainable Agriculture Project did a taste-test and cooking demo with summer campers as an end of summer harvest celebration.



Agritourism

The Farm provides support to several Development events each year.

Farm to Fork 2023

This August, Eliada hosted its second annual Farm to Fork Dinner and Social. 120 guests gathered on campus to enjoy a locally crafted dinner, go on a farm tour, hear updates about our farm and other campus programs, and participate in a silent auction. All proceeds from this event went to supporting Eliada's programs.



Fall Festival and Corn Maze

Eliada held its 15th annual Fall Festival and Corn Maze in September and October. It saw nearly 13,000 attendees over the course of the five-week event. We also hosted 12 corporate nights, booked 30 field trips, and hosted an Asheville Chamber of Commerce After Hours evening. The Fall Festival and Corn Maze is Eliada's biggest fundraiser.



Farm Tours

The Campus Farm continued hosting seasonal farm tours open to the general public. Farm tours are free of charge, but reservations are required. Tours are approximately 1 hour long and are walking guided tours of our farm facilities and growing spaces.

In the past year, we have...

- Hosted Volunteer groups from Publix, Warren Wilson College, Asheville Church, and Avery Dennison to jumpstart revamping the Learning Garden.
